

## Taylor County Commissioners' Court

December 31, 2013

The Commissioners' Court of Taylor County met in Regular Session on December 31, 2013, with the following members present:

1. Judge Downing A. Bolls Jr., County Judge
2. Randy Williams, Commissioner, Precinct 1
3. Kyle Kendrick, Commissioner, Precinct 2
4. Chuck Statler, Commissioner, Precinct 4

When the following motions were heard:

1. Judge Bolls convened the Court in open session at 10:00 a.m.

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2. Chris Hale, Chaplain Abilene Fire Department gave the invocation and Commissioner Williams led the Court in the Pledge of Allegiance.

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3. Commissioner Statler made a motion to approve the minutes of the meeting held on December 17, 2013 and to adopt the agenda for the meeting of December 31, 2013 as printed and posted. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Williams and carried unanimously.

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4. Commissioner Kendrick made a motion to approve bills from the following funds and to order them paid according to minutes of the accounts. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Williams and carried unanimously. [Exhibit]

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5. Sheriff Bishop reported to the Court that he had been contacted by the City of Abilene regarding the sewer lines being "stopped up" by inmates flushing solid

waste which should be put in trash cans. The City of Abilene has informed Sheriff Bishop that the County must take corrective action by installing some device or system to prevent large solid waste from flowing into the City sewer lines. Terrie Noret, Chief Jail Administrator mentioned that Jail personnel will tour several facilities such as the French Robertson Unit to determine how solid waste is handled. The City of Abilene requests that the Sheriff's Office contact them within thirty days to update them on a corrective action plan. Richard Greenawalt, County Purchasing Agent reported that he had done some research into options for the County and will continue. Commissioner Williams suggested that Jail Staff and Richard continue to collect information on alternatives. Commissioner Statler requested they report back to the Court providing an update on January 13, 2014. [Exhibit]

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6. Commissioner Kendrick made a motion to convene into Executive Session in accordance with Government Code §551.072, regarding Deliberations about real property. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Williams and carried unanimously.

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7. Commissioner Williams made a motion to reconvene in regular session. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Statler and carried unanimously.


