September 22, 2015

The Commissioners' Court of Taylor County met in Regular Session on September 22, 2015, with the following members present:

When the following motions were heard:

1. Judge Bolls convened the Court in open session at 10:00 a.m.

2. Pastor DeWayne Bush from First Baptist Church Tuscola gave the invocation and Commissioner Williams led the Court in the Pledge of Allegiance of the United States of America.

3. Commissioner Statler made a motion to approve the minutes of the meeting held on September 8, 2015 and to adopt the agenda for the meeting of September 22, 2015 as printed and posted. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Williams and carried unanimously.

7. Becky Freeman, First Assistant County Treasurer presented the August 2015 Treasurer's Report for approval. Beginning book balance for the General Fund was \$29,418,104.04 and market value was \$29,416,991.40; after receipts and disbursements the ending book balance was \$26,916,373.99 and the ending market value was \$26,918,115.39. Beginning book balance for all funds was \$46,357,785.28 and market value was \$46,356,672.64; the ending book balance was \$43,915,116.01 and the ending market value was \$43,916,857.41. Commissioner Statler made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report for the month ending August 31, 2015. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Kendrick and carried unanimously. [Exhibit]


8. Lt. John Cummins from the Sheriff's Department presented an interlocal agreement between Taylor County and Texas State University for tobacco law enforcement. The grant provides money for controlled buys/sting operations to catch merchants who sell tobacco products to minors. The grant is for \$8,625.00 and funds overtime expenses for officers working the stings. Commissioner Williams made a motion to approve the Interlocal Agreement between Texas State University and Taylor County for tobacco law enforcement as presented. [Exhibit]

9. Richard Greenawalt requested a 1993 bus be declared surplus; which will be sold at an upcoming auction. Commissioner Williams made a motion to declare the property surplus as recommended. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Egger and carried unanimously. [Exhibit]


